
Significance of Research

- Offers insights into the orientation and contours of space policies of emerging space powers that are constrained by geographical size and population
- Proposes national space policy and strategy for Singapore to guide political decision-making into integrating space activities to serve its national interests

Research Design

- Reviews space strategies, policies, programs, and sectoral developments (such as the commercial, security/defense, and civil sectors)
- ❖ Case selection: (1) small geographical size and population; (2) newly established space agency with contrasting focuses; (3) evidence of spending into national programs; (4) in different geographical regions

Comparative Case Studies of the UAE and Luxembourg



For Singapore

- Establish centralized agency to coordinate space activities and participate in multilateral mission and programs
- Initiate national space program with focus on space situational awareness (SSA) applications
- Strengthen STEM education and outreach through space-related or space-specific curricula

For the SAF

- Operate SSA capabilities to protect and defend national interests in and through space
- Develop tools to participate in multinational space operations and exercises such as US-led CSpOC and the France-led ASTERX
- Initiate defense and technology development cooperation
- Strengthen credibility and usefulness to international space community through burden-sharing on SSA operations
- Promote space norms and standards
- Promote local space economy

- Ensure accessibility and freedom of operations in space
- Gain operational experience and expertise in SSA
- Grow space intellects in the defense community
